Sergei Rachmaninov's Second Piano Concerto has long been a favorite of concert audiences everywhere — not only among this composer's works but within the entire body of music for piano and orchestra. Rachmaninoff, Piano Concerto No. 1

Piano Concerto No 1 in F# minor, Op 1 was composed in 1891 when Rachmaninoff was at age 18. He dedicated the work to Alexander Siloti and later revised the work thoroughly in 1917. Despite this was stated as first piano concerto, this was actually Rachmaninoff's second attempt at a piano concerto. In 1889 he had begun but

Sergei Rachmaninoff's long and fruitful relationship with The Philadelphian Orchestra began in 1909 with his first tour to America when he conducted his recently finished Second Symphony. In addition to the five works he would go on to write for the Orchestra, the composer also chose to collaborate in landmark recordings as both piano soloist

Sergei Rachmaninoff conducted the first Moscow performance of his Second Symphony on February 14, 1908, a week after its World Premiere. On

the same program he appeared as soloist in his Second Piano Concerto, and he was welcomed back to his homeland with enthusiasm The critic Yuli Engel wrote: After a year-and-a-half stay abroad

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restored, Rachmaninoff dashed off the Piano Concerto No 2 later that year and dedicated it to Dr Dahl The music has endured as one of his most popular works One of its themes was used in the 1940s as the basis for a hit song, "Full Moon and Empty Arms," and other themes were incorporated into movie scores, like Noel Coward's Brief Encounter
